
Castle MCR Handbook 2019/20

Dear postgraduate,

Congratulations on obtaining a place at University College, or 'Castle' as it's affectionately known. The Middle Common Room (MCR) would like to extend our own very warm welcome. We, the MCR, are the thriving, diverse and supportive community of postgraduates that call the castle our home. We hope and trust that you will enjoy your time with us in Durham.

As a college of a traditional university, Castle houses Junior (undergraduate), Middle (postgraduate), and Senior (staff, alumni etc.) common rooms. We, the MCR, meets in the Maurice E. Tucker Room, at the foot of the keep. You'll soon see for yourself that this is a spectacular room. We're immensely proud and lucky to call the Castle our home, and I hope that through eating meals in the Great Hall (available three times a day), working in the College Library (with beautiful views of the courtyard) and socialising in the Undercroft bar (the oldest student bar in the world), you'll come to feel at home here.

College-wide parties are held to celebrate events such as Hallowe'en, Christmas, Burns' Night, St. Patrick's Day, etc.

The MCR provides opportunities to meet & discuss with other academics across disciplines through MCR **seminars and lectures.** We run a yearly **conference** with attendees from all over the UK.

It is our sense of community that makes Castle MCR what we are. The MCR is supported by an elected Executive Committee (Exec) composed of eight postgraduates: President, Treasurer, Social Chair, Steward, Ball Chair, Secretary, Welfare Officer, and Academic Officer. The exec exists to serve the MCR community, organising events for its members, representing you to the College and University, and overseeing the day-to-day running of the MCR. If you ever have any need of us, or wish to make comments or suggestions, we are always happy to receive them. Anonymous feedback can be submitted via the website. The Exec is supported by a number of non-executive officers and a series of committees. You can join any of the committees at any point of the year to contribute to our society. Elections will be held in the first term, and you are encouraged to stand for election if you so wish

The Maurice Tucker Room



Located within the walls of the castle, at the foot of the Keep, the Maurice E. Formals

Formal hall, or just 'formal', held every Tuesday and Thursday during term-time, is a long-standing college tradition. It's a three-course meal held in the Great Hall to which academic dress is worn.

The JCR sit at Low Table (i.e. the majority of the tables in the Hall) and the SCR at High Table (the two or three rows of tables below the stained glass window). On Thursdays the MCR sit at Low Table with the JCR, but on Tuesdays we join the SCR on High Table, and in the SCR before and after formal

Formal commences at 7.00 pm sharp, when High Table enters the Great Hall. While those at High Table enter, all those who are at Low Table stand. Following this, the College Grace is said, after which all members sit for the meal, served by College staff. Everyone is required to remain seated throughout the meal (go to the toilet beforehand!), which normally finishes by 8.00pm, after which postgraduates retire to the SCR, MCR, or Undercroft, depending on the occasion.

FORMAL RULES

- 1. Stick to the dress code (above) or you may be refused entry.
- 2. Drinks must be purchased from the undie or MCR bar.
 - 3. Late arrival will result in no entry.
- 4. No mobile phones or photos during the meal.
- 5. Once grace has been said, you must remain seated & cannot leave the room until either the JCR Senior Student bows out (Thursdays) or the Master stands to leave (Tuesdays).
 - 6. Drunkenness will not be tolerated.

Academic Opportunities

One of the great benefits the MCR offers is the chance to share work and learn about interesting topics outside of your own discipline. There are many ways the get involved may it be by attending, participating or even joining the Academic Committee! Here are a few of the Academic ventures you can get involved in as part of Castle MCR

For those wishing to develop their teaching ability, we run a **Student Mentorship Program,** connecting MCR members with members of the JCR who are seeking help with their studies. This is a flexible, voluntary system running as often as you like. Our monthly **Sunday Seminars** give MCR members an informal platform to give short presentations related to their work. These events are great way to share your research & feature a free glass of wine for all attendees & speakers!

The culmination of the academic year is the MCR run

Castle Conference in June.

A two-day event featuring world renowned speakers and a delicious three course meal for all attending.

The Castle MCR Lecture series, allows members to showcase their work to the entire castle community in a more formal setting.

These are approximately 40 minutes long and precede Tuesday formals.

Welfare

Castle Welfare is the first point of contact for any issues you may have during your time at Castle. Whether this be the loss of a family member, an argument with a friend or suicidal thoughts, the Welfare team is made up of both Staff and Students who are always happy to help out. Everything said is kept 100% anonymous so please reach out. Welfare also keeps the MCR stocked with condoms, dental dams, lube and pregnancy tests, which are free to MCR members.



If you wish to speak to a female member of staff Paula can arrange for you to meet a staff member of another college on request. Rev. Richard Whaite also offers pastoral and spiritual support as well as signposting to other faith chaplains and societies across Durham. Additionally, the MCR Welfare committee run weekly drop-in sessions and can be contacted for 1-on-1 meetings in and outside of Castle.



As a postgraduate you can self-certify for coursework extensions of up to 1 week. For extensions longer than a week you will need to contact your module tutor and/or supervisor.

What can we do for you?

Sexual health

The MCR has a supply of sexual health items (condom, lube, dental dams and pregnancy tests) available for free in the MCR, these can be found in the far-right bookcase in the leather compartment. If it is empty please notify the Exec so these supplies can be replenished. Free condoms and lube are also obtainable with County Durham's C Card scheme. People between the ages of 13 and 24 can register for this scheme by going to Boots in the Market Place or on the North Road. The C Card also gives you access to sexual health information, advice and support.

Drop-in sessions

The MCR welfare committee runs several drop-in sessions per week advertised on the MCR Facebook page and on the MCR noticeboard. They take place in the MCR and usually run for an hour. These sessions are designed for any MCR member who wants an informal conversation with a member of the welfare team about an issue that is playing on their mind or even just someone to have lunch with or a friendly chat. Talking changes is a self-help and talking therapies service designed to help anyone living in the County Durham and Darlington area to deal with common mental health problems such as stress, anxiety or depression, as well as panic phobias, obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD) and post-traumatic stress disorder. The Durham LGBT+ Association

The Durham LGBT+ Association exists to provide welfare services, campaigns, and socials to anyone who identifies as being under the LGBT+ umbrella. As well as a confidential listening service, sexual health provision and STI testing kits, they organise various campaigns throughout the academic year such as the Trans Awareness Week (19th-25th November). Rainbow Night, their weekly meet-up, takes place on Mondays at 8pm at St. Cuthbert's Bar during term time and is open to members of JCRs and MCRs of all colleges. Sconce Fines issued by College Office or MCR President for poor behaviour or damage caused to university property.


SCR Senior Common Room refers to the room and the group of staff & lecturers that form the common room
